Pastoral Care

At Nottingham University Samworth Academy we pride ourselves on the quality of support, care and guidance given to individual pupils. At the core of this provision is a year system led by a Head of Year and supported by an Assistant Head of Year, together with mentors and the student services support team.

This system provides your child with the care they need whilst allowing them to nurture friendships and develop a strong sense of community.

As your child progresses through NUSA, their attainment and well-being will be closely monitored, ensuring that students are recognised and rewarded when they succeed and supported when things are more challenging.

Mentors play an active role in ensuring that students are happy, well supported and fully engaged in school life. Mentors also serve as the first point of contact between school and home. You will receive regular updates about your child's progress through termly reports, online data and a Parents' Evening.

NUSA is a very caring community and the health, happiness and well-being of students underpins our overall ethos and philosophy.

Curriculum

Our curriculum follows National Curriculum guidelines and aims to provide a broad, balanced learning experience for all.

At Key Stage 3 our two-year programme covers all the National Curriculum subjects. Students are taught in ability groups in the majority of subjects, ensuring that every child is educated at a level that matches their ability.

There is a three-year programme for Key Stage 4. All students study a core consisting of English, Mathematics, Science, Physical Education and Religious/Personal/Social/Health Education. Most students also study a language and either History or Geography. This is supplemented by a wide range of optional subjects, including Visual and Performing Arts, Technology and ICT courses.

We expect most of our students to achieve at least eight passes at grades A* - C, including English and Mathematics. Every student is actively encouraged to work towards the new English Baccalaureate standard, invaluable for university applications.

NUSA Post-16 offers a range of pathways for students who wish to continue learning with us during Key Stage 5. A range of A-Level courses and BTEC diplomas offer students the opportunity to improve their employability or eligibility for university. We pride ourselves on promoting the highest aspirations for all our students.









Nottingham University Samworth Academy offers a comprehensive programme of extracurricular activities enabling students to extend their learning beyond the classroom.

We have access to excellent sports facilities and students enjoy activities including football, netball, rugby, tennis and athletics.

The Performing Arts take a leading role in school life with regular dance and drama productions allowing all students to fully explore their creativity.

In addition, we host a wide range of enrichment activities including film club, table tennis coaching and our Radio Club.





Facilities









Nottingham University Samworth Academy has an outstanding range of facilities to ensure every child has the best learning opportunities. We believe it is very important to encourage our students to develop their interests and aspirations and our school provides them with the facilities to do so.

The building provides a safe, welcoming and accessible learning environment for pupils of all ages. The school has been designed to be more environmentally friendly too, with a green living roof, rain water recycling and a biodiesel boiler using renewable energy.

'The Restaurant' is at the very heart of Academy life, with healthy and nutritious food served in a modern and stylish environment.

A large, dynamic sports hall plays host to a variety of indoor activities including basketball, cricket and trampolining, encouraging our pupils to engage in a wide range of physical exercise. For students with a passion for the performing arts. Our lecture theatre is the ideal venue for school shows and productions. The academy also has a fully equipped radio studio allowing pupils to develop their presentation skills and creativity.

All classrooms are equipped with smartboards to encourage interesting, interactive lessons. A suite of Apple iMac computers provides students with the opportunity to unleash their creativity on industry-standard software.


If you have any questions regarding transition at any stage of the process, please do not hesitate to ask. Staff are always available to answer questions at our various events or you can e-mail the school at any time.
