#### Attitude to Learning at NUSA:

I am writing to you to give some clarification about the way we are reporting on Attitude to Learning during this academic year.

# What is ATL?

ATL stands for Attitude to Learning. Our school places great emphasis upon developing each pupil's Attitude to Learning. We want our pupils to be curious learners who fully engage in every learning opportunity. We expect all pupils to take responsibility for their own learning through actively participating in lessons, developing their resilience and perseverance to overcome challenges. Pupils are recognised and rewarded for their positive attitude to learning on a daily basis. We encourage pupils daily to reflect on their specific strengths and areas for development, enabling them to maximise their learning potential.

#### Why is it important?

Within school, a pupil's Attitude to Learning can influence their whole experience of education and have significant effects on their overall levels of attainment, engagement and well-being. If your child displays a consistently outstanding attitude, they will be successful.

We want all options open for your child, when they leave school. The hard work starts at NUSA, but the skills will benefit them for the rest of their lives.

Using apps such as Unifrog and Bromcom, we will be able to give more opportunities to your child to be able to reflect and become the very best learner.

### Criteria that makes up ATL

Within ATL, there are 4 elements that we look for:

- Willing to learn
- Resilient
- Self-motivated
- Determined

Grade	Attitude To Learning
1	Outstanding- going above and beyond!
2	Good- getting the basics right.
3	Requires Improvement to fulfil potential.
4	Inadequate- will not be successful.

Then, by taking into account the work produced, the effort, the determination, the contribution by your child; a teacher will input a grade from 1-4. The grid on the left breaks down what a number means. These are shared on your child's report. Through providing this information, both school and home can work together to ensure every child enjoys the progress they deserve. Any pupil who displays an Attitude to Learning that is either 'Requires Improvement' or 'Inadequate' will be supported and challenged, to make the most out of every learning opportunity at NUSA.
